## **POLICY LETTER**

Motion-That the Commission adopts Policy 2.22, Social Media, to establish responsibilities and procedures for implementing standards for the use of Social Media -was made by Commissioner Drew, seconded by Commissioner Deon, and passed unanimously.

Szyjko), a partial take parcel necessary for construction of the Southern Beltway, Rt. 22 to I-79, by authorizing payment of \$3,820.50 representing fair market value, pro-rated taxes and recording fees to Coon & Company; authorize the appropriate Commission officials to execute the Agreement of Sale and other documents that may be required for closing; authorize the payment of additional statutory damages as calculated by the Right-of-Way Administrator and approved by the Chief Counsel; and payment of damages to the property owners is contingent upon their delivery of a deed prepared by the Legal Department;

Motion-That the Commission approves increasing the previously approved not-to-exceed amount (December 15, 2015 Commission Meeting (item F- 8b) of \$3,000,000.00 for biennial bridge inspection with Parsons Brinckerhoff, Inc. to \$4,000,000.00 due to changes in federal regulations requiring additional levels of training, inspection and reporting requirements that have significantly increased the overall cost of perform bridge inspections-was made by Commissioner Drew, seconded by Commission Lieberman; Commissioner Logan abstained.
