The Commission has selected firm Sucevic, Piccolomini & Kuchar Engineering, Inc. for award based on the Commission's determination that the firm's Statement of Interest is the most advantageous to the Commission as determined by the Commission based on its review of all materials submitted. The firm has demonstrated it exceeds the requirements of this project and has performed very well on its current project, with similar services, thus demonstrating the ability to deliver the required services. Sucevic, Piccolomini & Kuchar Engineering, Inc. is a Pennsylvania based firm and currently holds one contract with the Commission which will expire the end of this year.
